K.C.G. “SUMMER EXHIBITION” LAUNCH

K.C.G. FRIENDS Julie Hayes (Gawler), MAL CRAIG (Kapunda) and ROBERT ANDERSON (Kapunda) took out the First, Second and Third Awards in this year's Exhibition, judged by Artist and former Director of the Royal South Australian Society of Arts, GERHARD RITTER.

The Hanging Team had quite a challenge with 83 entries by 35 different Artists covering a variety of media. Eventually all exhibits were accommodated with pleasing results.

Newly elected LRC Deputy Mayor Deane Rohrlach officially opened the Exhibition, commenting on the diversity of exhibits and the mutually advantageous ties between Kapunda Rotary and the Gallery in delivering the bi-annual Kidman Rotary Art Show in Kapunda.

Forty nine people attended the Opening, which was also the opportunity to present retiring KCG Committee member Christian Vocke with Life Membership of the Gallery. Christian exhibited in the very first Exhibition held in the Gallery in 1989. Since that time he has been continuously involved in numerous Gallery-related activities—including creating his popular 'Jester' Ceramics, painting and printmaking for the Shop and Exhibitions; gallery sitter; Exhibition hanger; voluntary workshop Printmaking Tutor as well as several years on the KCG Committee. COPYRIGHT

The issue of Copyright has, and is of concern to the Gallery. Artists need to be aware that there are severe consequences if brought to Court and are reminded that just because you may be a "Hobby Artist" and it is a "Community Gallery" you are NO LESS

RESPONSIBLE (nor less likely to get "caught"!)

The following information compiled by the BURRA REGIONAL GALLERY sets it out clearly and unambiguously. **PLEASE READ, REMEMBER and ABIDE!**

- As a Gallery displaying art for public viewing and sale it is our duty to ensure that copyright laws are enforced, which is why we publicise the copyright procedures. It is in no way meant to criticise anyone's artistic ability. **Most galleries will now not accept work that is not original uncopied work.**
- **THE PROBLEM ARISES WHEN YOU USE SOMEONE ELSE'S IMAGES FROM PHOTOGRAPHS, MAGAZINES, CALENDARS, INTERNET, VIDEOS, ETC.**
- Copyright legally belongs to the artist or photographer from the moment of creation. The absence of a copyright notice on a photograph does not mean copyright does not apply.
- In Australia all artworks, including photographs are automatically protected by copyright once they are created and put into "material form".
- There is no rule allowing you to copy artworks without permission if you make a certain number of changes or change a certain percentage of the original work.
- Copyright protection lasts for 70 years after the creator's death or 70 years from the end of the year the material was first made public. (50 years for material made for, or published by a Commonwealth or State government department or agency.)
- Most photographs taken before 1955 are now in public domain. Under the free trade agreement with USA if copyright had expired by 1 January 2005 it stays expired and can be used under Australian law. **Please check the copyright council website to see what is in public domain.**
- ***If copying from the internet or using clip art you must read the terms and conditions carefully, as the licences may limit ways in which images may be used. Some images can be bought, if permission or purchase of an image has occurred please add this information the 'Exhibitor's form' attached to the back of your artwork. This also applies if you seek permission, or purchase an image out of a magazine, calendar etc as this must be acknowledged in the exhibition catalogue under the name of the artist.***
- Copyright does not protect an idea or concept, styles or techniques. Copyright protects the way the idea is expressed as a drawing or other visual representation, such as painting, sculpture or work of artistic craftsmanship.
- **THE BEST WAY TO AVOID BEING IN BREACH OF COPYRIGHT IS TO WORK FROM YOUR OWN PHOTOGRAPHS.**

HANGING DEVICES AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR KAPUNDA COMMUNITY GALLERY

Because of the Gallery's somewhat 'archaic' hanging system (picture rail, shark line, screw hooks) all hanging works MUST be fitted with flat 'D' rings and a TAUT wire. (NOT CORD)

The D rings should be fitted a suitable distance from the top of the work so that the work hangs fairly flat and does NOT tip forward when hung. D rings must be of a suitable size to bear the weight of the picture and allow the hook through.

Works should be suitably framed, or in the case of unframed works have the edges painted/finished neatly.

All works must have an information label firmly attached to the back bottom corner with the Title, Artist's name, media and price clearly written. 3D items should have the label underneath.

DELIVERY AND COLLECTION AT K.C.G.

ARTWORKS ARE ALWAYS DELIVERED ON A GIVEN TUESDAY, TO THE GALLERY BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 10 and 4.

Delivery dates are given in the Newsletters.

Alternative arrangements for EARLY delivery can be made with the Ex. Coordinator

(85663159) but MUST be made at least 2 days PRIOR to due date of delivery.

WORKS NOT AT THE GALLERY BY 4pm TUESDAY CAN NOT BE HUNG.

Time and attention is given to hanging and reshuffling is not possible.

Artworks are ALWAYS collected on a given Monday, as notified in the Newsletter.

Contact Ex. Coordinator if this is not possible PRIOR to collection date.

(Storage facility may soon not be available so try to get someone else to collect yours if necessary.)

FOR THE FIRST TIME (for paperwork). New paperwork is only required for FIRST timers.

HANGING APPARATUS is **exactly** the same as for the Gallery.

Again there are time constraints on hanging

and late work can not be accepted. (Work can be delivered/collected by a relative or friend as long as we know prior.)

COMMON SENSE AT LAST!

We are now able to serve alcohol at Openings (with certain conditions attached) without having to apply for a Liquor License each time.
