HANGING DEVICES AND ARRANGEMENTS

Works should be suitably framed. If on unframed canvas the edges should be finished neatly.

Glass should be clean. Check for marks on the inside of the glass.

All hanging works must be fitted with <u>large</u> D rings. Minimum size is as illustrated below <u>left.</u> This enables the hanging hook to fit easily into the D ring.

Any artwork that does not have the right D rings will not be hung..

(This has been an ongoing problem for the hanging team as incorrect D rings makes correct hanging very difficult.)

The D rings should be <u>placed from a quarter to one-third down</u> from the top of the frame with a taut (not tight) wire between—<u>centre</u> illustration below


We do not hang by wire. Please do not use cord.


D rings must be placed so that they **clear the inside edge of the frame** (so that the hanging hook has easy access) **as illustrated below** <u>right.</u>.


PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOUR PICTURE FRAMER.

D rings are for sale in Kapunda Community Gallery.

All works must have a LABEL firmly attached to bottom rear corner of work showing TITLE, ARTIST'S NAME, MEDIUM & PRICE. 3D items should have the label underneath.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR: From JOHN & GWENDA REES A visit to the Brisbane Art Gallery—12/6/14

"We were at the cultural end of Brisbane's famous South Bank and decided to have a look about in the Art Gallery of Brisbane. We had been there for perhaps half an hour when we went around the corner of one of its many space dividing walls. There, in a large glass-fronted display cabinet were two huge 6-panelled screens by 17th century Japanese artist Kano Yasunobu, and we were stopped in our tracks. Each panel was a little over 130cm wide by 240cm high (4.5ft x 8ft) on plain wooden frames covered with gold leaf on paper. The great brush paintings were done in plain hand-made black ink in classical Japanese style.

One screen was a simple painting of different sized tree branches and a few birds. The other, even more classically simple was of the highest artistic them of a few pieces of bamboo.

The sheer emotional power of those beautiful, simple panels, went deep into our 'beings,cont. Page 4
