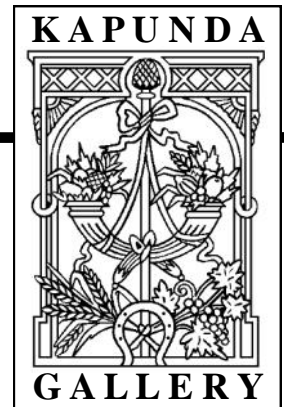

FROM THE CHAIRPERSON—Maxine Donald. Kapunda Community Gallery Inc.

The proposed Constitution has been resubmitted to Consumer and Business Services for approval following a necessary inclusion that was attended to at the Special General Meeting in April. I will let you know via this column when approval is obtained, however the changes will not come into effect until 1 February 2017.

Meanwhile, your committee is continually working on a Policy and Procedures Manual and updated comprehensive filing system that will assist everyone to find information quickly. This is no small task but bit by bit we are doing it!

Our next exhibition (opening on June 5) will present the work of a number of Namibian artists. As one thinks about the differences of culture, materials and living it becomes exciting to anticipate what this exhibition will bring to our Gallery. Join us at the Opening to see for yourselves. I for one am looking forward to it.

Have you visited the **Gallery Gift Shop** recently? There are some new suppliers and new stock, in addition to the very popular existing work. Anyone looking for original cards and gifts need look no further so encourage friends and relatives to investigate the potential for that really original and personal gift—made by an artist!

Currently in window 4, Peter Thompson's artwork, drums and small wooden 'goodies' compliment the gallery beautifully. The historical displays in windows 1 and 2 (until the end of May) have elicited a lot of comment and unearthed 'connections' for visitors to Kapunda. KCG is pleased to have these local displays on view. The second of the 'Drawing Our History' days (a cooperative venture between KCG and the Kapunda Historical Society for History Month) will take place on Thurs. 26 May at the Museum, 10am to 3pm. Entry is \$10—shared by the Museum and KCG. Bookings with me on 0408 817 038 and pay on the day. The first day produced drawings of old wheelchairs, a casket carrier, measuring scales, lamps, washing machines, cookers and baths including Sir Sidney Kidman's lovely long claw-foot model!

Recently I was talking to a (city) stranger as I sat drawing in a street in Edithburgh. He asked me why artists seem to be drawn to settle in country towns. I could only answer from my own experience—the lure of nature in abundance; quiet; affordable and a real sense of 'community' for those seeking it. It is not surprising that artists move to towns and regions where there is already a significant art presence as it means the opportunity to associate with 'like-minded' people. Kapunda has such a range of 'artistic' pursuits available to those wanting to be involved.

Thanks go once again to all KCG (and community) volunteers—where would our country be without them all? (KCG always needs more so if you, or anyone you know is available for a minimum 3 hours per month, speak up!)
